1. Topic of the Conference

This year's conference of the International Scientific Committee on Theory and Philosophy of Conservation and Restoration is focused on accessibility of cultural heritage. It will discuss the theoretical and practical problems of inclusiveness and constraints in perception, conservation and presentation of monuments and sites.

2. Purpose and Scope of the Conference

The International Scientific Committee for Theory and Philosophy of Conservation and Restoration in collaboration with the Fondazione Romualdo Del Bianco-Life Beyond Tourism is organizing the International conference entitled Accessibility of Cultural Heritage: Inclusiveness and constraints in Conservation of Cultural Heritage (Florence 11-12 April 2022).

The aim of the conference is to discuss different aspects of physical and intellectual access to cultural heritage. Following the intellectual and social processes of their recognition, initiated at the beginning of the 20th century (Alois Riegl's *Democratization of Monuments*, Gerard Baldwin Brown's *Present Popular Movement* in 1905, with the contribution of Italian legislation on cultural heritage) and continued in contemporary global societies, we will discuss the problems of inclusiveness and constraints, accessibility and unavailability of heritage, human rights and conservation ethics, quality of life and sustainable use, both in practical and theoretical aspects.

The conference will be organized as three thematic sessions:

- 1. **Principles**: Theoretical issues in reconciling accessibility and heritage
- 2. Issues of Authenticity and Integrity in the adaptation of monuments and sites to public needs
- 3. **Technologies**: The use of technologies to improve accessibility to heritage, and its implications
- 4. **Case Studies**: Practical examples of the successful adaptation of monuments to public needs.
